Clyde Edgerton to Entertain at the FOL's Annual Dinner

An "American Treasure" Comes to Campus March 3, 2005

Nationally acclaimed author and guitarist Clyde Edgerton and fellow musicians in the Rank Strangers Band will entertain attendees of the 2005 UNCG Friends of the Library Annual Dinner, scheduled for March 3 in Cone Ballroom of Elliott University Center.

The North Carolina native grew up in the small town of Bethesda near Durham and enjoyed the company of a large, extended family. After graduating from The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill with a degree in English, he entered the U.S. Air Force in 1966 as a fighter pilot. Following his military service, he earned a master's degree from UNC Chapel Hill and taught English at his high-school alma mater. He went on to earn a doctoral degree. In May 1978 he rather

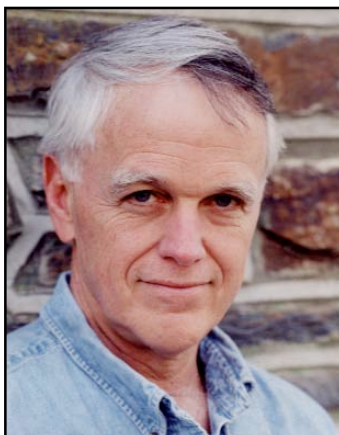
concisely decided to become a professional writer. After watching Eudora Welty read one of her stories on television, he wrote in

his journal: "May 14, 1978 — Tomorrow, May 15, 1978 — I would like to start being a writer."

Eight highly entertaining and hilarious novels followed, including *Raney* (1985); *Walking Across Egypt* (1987, which was made into a movie in 1999 starring Ellen Burstyn), *Redeye* (1995); *Where Trouble Sleeps* (1999); and his latest novel, *Lunch at the Piccadilly* (2003).

Edgerton is the recipient of a Guggenheim Fellowship, a Lyndhurst Fellowship, and the North Carolina Award for Literature, a Distinguished Alumni Award from the Education Department of The University of North Carolina Chapel Hill, and five notable book awards from *The New York Times*. The *San Diego Union-Tribune* hailed him as an "American Treasure."

But Edgerton's lively talents extend beyond the written word. A former member of the Tarwater Band, Edgerton is also an accomplished musician and songwriter. His performance at UNCG will feature a mix of the beloved writer's reading from his novels, commentary, his trademark humor, and the Americana music of the Rank Strangers. •

Rosann Bazirjian Appointed University Librarian

UNCG Welcomes Experience, Enthusiasm, and Expertise

Appointed University Librarian effective August 15, Rosann Bazirjian comes to The University of North Carolina at Greensboro from The Pennsylvania State University, where she has served as Assistant Dean for Technical and Access Services in the Libraries since 1999. In this position she was responsible for all aspects of library access (including interlibrary loan, lending, disability services, and reserves), acquisitions, business operations, and cataloging.

Ms. Bazirjian previously held positions at Florida State University, Syracuse University, and The University of West Florida. She is a former member of the PALINET Board of Trustees and of the OCLC Members Council and has served on committees and task forces of several professional library organizations. The author of 28 articles, chapters, and reviews, she has co-edited four volumes of the annual Charleston

Conference Proceedings. At Penn State, she was involved in several projects involving the use of information technology to enhance library services and was recently appointed to a task force of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting to examine national metadata standards for digital programming. In July 2004, she became President-Elect of the Association for Library Collections and Technical Services. She will assume the role of President of the ALCTS in 2005.

Ms. Bazirjian received a bachelor's degree from the City University of New York, a Master of Science in Library Science from Columbia University, and a Master of Social Science from the Maxwell School of Public Administration at Syracuse University. She succeeds Doris Hulbert, who retired after nearly 24 years at UNCG, 14 of them as Director of the Jackson Library. •

Library's many existing strengths to reach new levels of excellence and expertise. ...

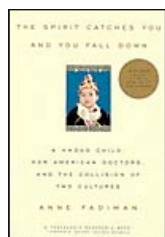

The Elusive Quest for Growth

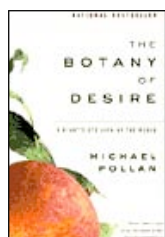

The sweetness of apples, for example, induced the early Americans to spread the species, giving the tree a whole new continent in which to blossom. So who is really domesticating whom?

Hodges Dedication

Martha Blakeney Hodges Special Collections and University Archives Department and Reading Room Dedicated

The Martha Blakeney Hodges Special Collections and University Archives Department and the Hodges Reading Room were formally dedicated at a ceremony in Jackson Library on May 18. Earlier, Mrs. Hodges' children Luther Hodges and Betsy Bernard, along with their spouses Cheray Hodges and Donald Bernard of Durham, pledged \$1 million to endow the Special Collections and University Archives and to name the Reading Room after their mother, who was the first chairperson of the UNCG Friends of the Library when it was formed in 1959.

The dedication ceremony included remarks by Chancellor Patricia Sullivan, Mr. Hodges, University Librarian Doris Hulbert, and Special Collections Librarian Bill Finley. A commemorative keepsake printed on the Library's 19th-century printing press was distributed; the printing press was acquired with the help of Martha Blakeney Hodges in the 1960s.

As part of the dedication ceremony, Jackson Library accepted the gift of two significant volumes for the Special Collections: first edition copies of Mark Twain's *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer* (1876) and *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* (1885). These books

cemented Twain's reputation as a major literary figure and were quickly recognized as significant titles in American literature. To this day they remain Twain's most popular works, with *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* appearing on almost every list of great American novels. Jackson Library is pleased to add these two titles to a growing collection of Mark Twain first editions. •

UNCG WRITING PROGRAM professor Bob Watson liked to tell students that the Library was a great place to seek the muse. Watson's words of advice are even engraved on the plaque hanging in Jackson Library that commemorates the Library's being named a Literary Landmark by Friends of Libraries USA.

In 2004, Algonquin Books of Chapel Hill published a first novel by a man who took those words to heart. Each morning for two years, local businessman John May came to Jackson Library to research and write the novel that became *Poe & Fanny*. Seating himself at the same table on the 9th

floor of the Library (the table is no longer there due to renovation, he notes ruefully), John immersed himself in Poe's life and began to write. In time, he became like a member of the Library staff. He came to know us by our first names, and his presence came to be expected. We followed his progress with interest and were cheered when first he found an agent and then a publisher. In time, we asked him to join the Friends of the Library Board, and soon the enthusiastic library supporter became co-chair of the Friends of the Library, providing us with leadership of the first order.

In May 2004, the novel was published, and it is with a certain pride that we welcome our friend John May to the ranks of those writers who have sought and found the muse in Jackson Library. •

New Materials Donated to Hodges Special Collections and University Archives

LETTERS FROM AN alumna working as a missionary in pre-World War II China. A 16th-century manuscript. A poster from the 1936 Olympic Games in Berlin. These are but a few of the latest acquisitions by the Hodges Special Collections and University Archives.

Lelia Judson Tuttle was a member of the class of 1900 of the State Normal & Industrial College (now UNCG). In 1909, after teaching in North Carolina and doing graduate work at Columbia University, she became chair of English Literature at the McTyeire Institute in Shanghai. In 1926 she transferred to Soochow University, where she remained until 1942 when she returned to North Carolina. While in China, Tuttle acquired various pieces of art and wrote more than 40 letters, which she donated to Caldwell County in the late 1950s. These items have now been transferred to UNCG, with some going to the Historical Costume Collection in the School of Human Environment Sciences and others coming to the Hodges Special Collections and University Archives.

Romance Languages Professor David Fein recently donated 21 French legal documents — dating from 1553

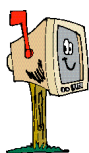


to 1893 — to the Hodges Special Collections and University Archives. The documents include marriage contracts, a court judgment, land sales and transfers, and a power of attorney. Of particular interest is the 1533 document, which is written on vellum and measures approximately 2 feet by 4 feet.

The Katherine Toll Collection has been added to the Women Veterans Historical Collection. Toll served in the WAVES from 1942 to 1946, where she edited “Shore Salt,” a monthly newsletter for the Women Reserve in the First Naval District. During

1946, she served as the Acting District Historic Officer for the decommissioning of the Third Naval District. Among the items in the collection are letters; a day-by-day account of basic WAVES training at Northampton, Massachusetts; a manuscript of an unpublished book about the WAVES; publications relating to service in the Navy; and Navy recruiting posters. Also in the collection are items dating back to her years before joining the WAVES, when she worked for various newspapers. Included are playbills from plays in New York and a poster from the 1936 Olympics. •

JACKSON LIBRARY has received a collection of Jewish periodicals donated by Rabbi Jonathan Malino of Greensboro



and Professor Frances Malino of Wellesley College in

memory of their late father, Rabbi Jerome Malino. For nearly 67 years, Rabbi Malino led the United Jewish Center in Danbury, CT, and was one of the 20th century’s leading Reform rabbis in North America. The collection, consisting of 38 titles and nearly 600 volumes, adds significant depth to the Library’s collection

in the field of Jewish studies. The gift was formally accepted at the Henry S. Levinson Lecture in Religious Studies on October 26. Professor Frances Malino was the guest speaker at the Lecture. For information about donating collections to the Library, call 336-334-5880. •

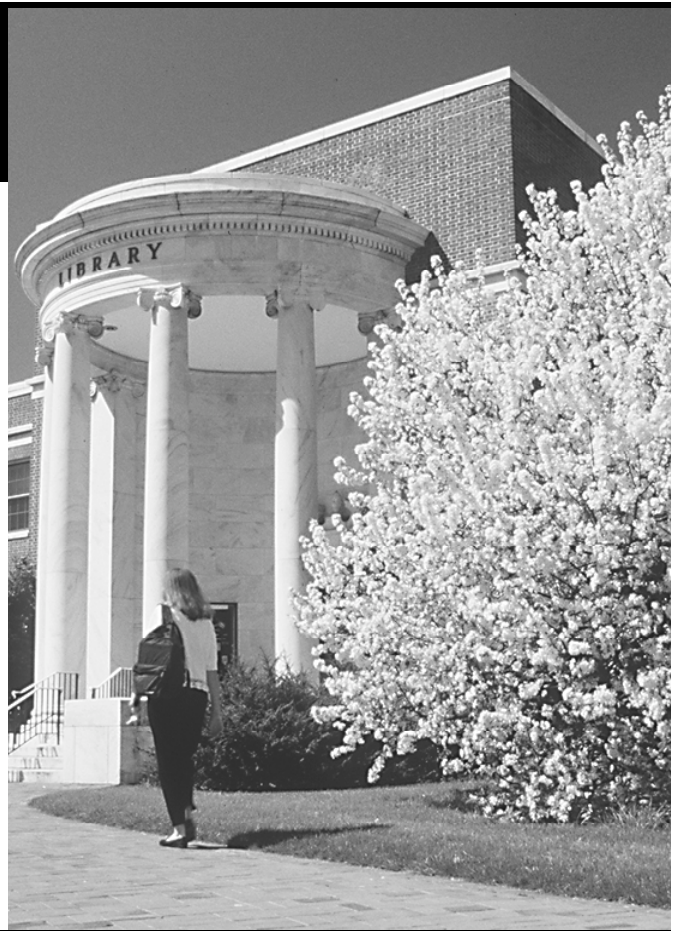
